
WHY STUDY IN DAEJEON IN SOUTH KOREA?


Welcome to Endicott College of International Studies.




FUTURE CAREERS, FUTURE EDUCATION



STUDYING AT ENDICOTT

Management Studies

You Learn

The Management Studies program prepares students to handle challenges in any functional area—anywhere in the world. Students learn a variety of hard, soft and international skills in all areas of business—from accounting to marketing, finance, economics, management, entrepreneurship, and international business.

Management Studies students also learn about technology, innovation and international affairs—and explore the key social, political, economic, and global issues facing the world today. Students learn to lead, manage and execute—as well as develop, implement and communicate cutting edge ideas and creative solutions. Curriculum focuses on real-world approach to management in a variety of industries rather than one.

You Earn

Graduates earn a Bachelor of Arts in Management Studies from the Endicott College of International Studies. In addition, students will be able to take the PMI's Project Management Professional (PMP) @ certification upon completion of studies.

You Prepare

Students prepare for careers in a variety of fields, including: management consultant, project manager, financial analyst, marketing executive, product manager, business analyst, sustainability consultant, logistics and distribution manager, systems analyst, risk manager, human resources manager, training manager, assistant manager, department head, vice president, and chief executive officer.

Students also work with faculty to ensure their career goals are met by creating and implementing a professional development plan and acquiring those skills that give them the competitive edge they need.

You Grow

Students will develop into engaging and insightful leaders who can contribute and guide teams and organizations successfully. Students will come to understand how their own talent can add practical value to an organization. Through experiential learning, students will cultivate their capacity to be managers of the highest caliber—and be aware of their responsibilities in an organizational context.

Technology Studies

You Learn

Technology Studies department aims to provide students with the necessary knowledge, skills and abilities regarding with the latest and the most innovative technologies; with a specific emphasis on Industry 4.0 requirements. Students will follow the analysis, design, development, implementation, and evaluation steps of scientific and technological knowledge.

Technology studies explores technology's role in social, political, economic, and global issues via courses in humanities, international studies, management, science, and social studies, plus technology-specific classes on Industry 4.0 topics such as IOT, cybersecurity, cloud, big data analytics, augmented reality, and robotics.

You Earn

Graduates earn a Bachelor of Arts in Technology Studies from the Endicott College of International Studies. Students are also encouraged to complete at least one industry professional certification in a related discipline.


Technology Studies department concentrates on four major tracks: Technology Management (data management and analytics, data communications and networking), Advanced Technology (augmented reality, cyber security, IoT), Advanced Automation (robotics, industrial automation, 3D Printing) and Advanced Intelligence (big data, artificial intelligence, cloud computing).

You Prepare

Students prepare for careers in a variety of fields, including: software developer, computer systems analyst, information security analyst, IT manager, computer systems administrator, database administrator, computer support specialist, augmented reality product developer, 3D graphics developer, big data analyst, cloud support analyst, cloud architect, and robotics technician. Students will decide their career paths with the guidance of their academic mentors who are specialized in different Industry 4.0 areas.

You Develop

Technology Studies students will develop innovative strategies, tools and knowledge regarding the utilization of different technologies. By being technology managers, students will develop and implement high tech solutions and plans in different organizations. Technology Studies graduates will bring Industry 4.0 philosophy and framework to their prospective jobs.



International Studies

You Learn

The International Studies program prepares students for an increasingly complex world by developing practical knowledge and theory-enhanced skills to solve pressing social, economic, political and environmental challenges. The program cuts across disciplines, geographies, world regions, ethnic, and national boundaries to propose novel ways of interpreting the world today. Competencies such as intercultural understanding, historical analysis, conflict resolution, political and economic theories, and linguistic proficiencies, are studied in local and global contexts.

You Earn

Graduates earn a Bachelor of Arts in International Studies from the Endicott College of International Studies at Woosong University. Students receive topical, regional and linguistic expertise, and practical job placements during their studies. The department especially specializes in peacekeeping, peacemaking, peacebuilding, and diplomacy training.

You Prepare

Students prepare for careers in a variety of fields, including: civil service, international work, journalism, law, politics, humanitarian work, diplomacy, United Nations, international business, non-profit and non-governmental leadership, teaching, and advanced research. Faculty work closely with students to develop their career-oriented skill sets.

You Give

International Studies students will focus on preparing for jobs that improve their own condition and more broadly make the world a better place. During their studies they will participate in community, national and international service toward this objective. The International Studies program works with students committed to social betterment.

Interdisciplinary Studies

You Learn

The Interdisciplinary Studies program at Endicott College allows you to take control of your education, gaining the skills and knowledge you need to accomplish your unique personal and professional goals. Working closely with an advisor, you design a custom curriculum, drawing from courses in International Studies, Management Studies, and Technology Studies. If you are a highly motivated, self-directed student interested in multiple disciplines, or if your career aspirations don't fit traditional academic subjects, Interdisciplinary Studies may be the program for you. This program contains flexibility that allows students to gain a breadth of knowledge across academic majors, while also attaining depth in a particular area through a required minor.

You Earn

Graduates earn a Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies from the Endicott College of International Studies, with a concentration in any of the three programs taught at Endicott. Depending on their course of study, students may also be positioned to pursue certifications several professional fields. Finally, the self-guided nature of the program gives students experience in long term planning and self-directed personal and professional development.

You Prepare

Given the wide range of disciplines covered through the self-designed degree program, graduates have a wide range of careers options, including: business, politics, law, healthcare, economics, entertainment, media, education, government, NGOs, policy analysis, journalism, writing, research, academics, and public relations.

You Decide

Interdisciplinary program students understand the value of responsibility and self-direction, and gain great experience in working with their academic advisors to create a program of study that is right for them. Studying across fields and disciplines, these students are exposed to the widest range of ideas, and can collaborate and develop relationships with students in all departments. With each student pursuing his/her own unique blend of management, international, and technological study, there is great potential for insight and innovation.




JOINT PROGRAMS / GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP

Exchange Program

Endicott students have an opportunity to study abroad in another university where they will be able to explore a new and exciting country and culture for 1 or 2 semesters. Exchange programs are available at all of our partner universities. An up to date list of our partner universities can be found on our website.

Dual Degree Program

This program allows students to study at Endicott for 2 or 3 years while earning one degree then completing another 1 or 2 years at one of our partner universities to earn a second degree. ENDICOTT CAREER DEVELOPMENT CENTER

The mission of the Career Development Center (CDC) is to foster excellence in career preparation for all students. Through its wide network of business partnerships and alumni members, it assists students with their job search and job applications, making sure students benefit from possible emerging job opportunities and internship opportunities off-campus.

Career Advisor Professor Program (CAP)

CAP is a program in which every freshman has an Endicott professor from their area of expertise as a career advisor. The professor will discuss with the student their specific academic needs at Endicott, give advice on which courses to take, and assist the student in the creation of their own personalized career plan. In conjunction with Career Development Center (CDC), CAP will help find job opportunities upon graduation from Endicott. CAP is not limited to four years; we expect our graduates to keep in touch with Endicott long after they have graduated.

Career Fairs

Endicott's Career Center hosts a variety of events throughout the year that bring students and recruiters together right here on campus. Students can use these events to:

- Meet with recruiters targeting Endicott students
- Learn more about the application process/timelines
- Discover new options

Immersion

Endicott students have the opportunity to participate in immersions, which are half-day, on-site trips to companies and organizations. Students learn about different industries by visiting a variety of organizations' workplaces. In a small group setting (~15), students will engage with professionals, be welcomed by staff, tour the company, and explore their interests by experiencing a typical workday. In other terms, your students can 'See the space. Meet the people. Do the job!'

Immersion are half-day, on-site trips to companies and organizations. Each semester, Endicott hosts Immersion focused on a diverse range of industries.

STUDENT MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Every Endicott student is assigned a faculty mentor who meets with the student to discuss their progress during the semester. The mentor helps the student to ensure their learning objectives are met. Through the experience and guidance of their mentors, Endicott students gain valuable insights into the fields of study.



RESIDENCE SolGeo



SolGeo is the residence for all students admitted to Endicott. Students are automatically matched up with a roommate from a different country and are highly encouraged to live their first semester of studies there. After their first semester, students may apply for other residences or opt to live off-campus. For the spring and fall, the residence fee includes a breakfast charge; for lunch and dinner, however, students are free to purchase a meal ticket at their convenience. In the summer and winter, no breakfast fee is charged, and all meals may be purchased with a meal ticket. In addition to the rooms, SolGeo is a modern, clean, safe, and Wi-Fi-accessible facility that features a library, dance studio, common kitchen, and various study halls and classrooms. Located on the East side of the campus, SolGeo is close to the nearby shops, restaurants, subway line, and various bus routes.



CAMPUS LIFE

Student Services

Endicott Student Services assists students with their payment of fees, scholarships, banking, medical insurance, visa inquiries, driver's license and vehicle registrations, residence affairs, locker rentals, print cards, meals, and part-time job opportunities on campus. It is also responsible for organizing excursions and other programs that will encourage the development of a well-rounded Asian Thought Leader.

Endicott Student Services welcomes new students through the airport meet-up service, bus terminal pick-up service, peer group program, and the team-building orientation week. It organizes various volunteer opportunity programs and fun, multicultural programs that help students develop their Endicott Spirit and a sense of belonging, soft skills, appreciation and understanding of cultural differences, leadership, and team work.

Team-Building Orientation

The orientation program at Endicott is very unique. It is called "Team-Building" and it lasts one full week. New students are divided in teams and are led by a peer group leader who will guide them with the entire settlement process, helping newcomers cope with the foreseeable and unpredictable challenges ahead the road.

Peer Group Program

Endicott students have the opportunity to develop their leadership skills when they participate in the peer group program. The program selects students with above average leadership skills and the ability to embrace cultural diversity for the creation of the best team synergy. Peer group leaders take care of the newly admitted to Endicott during the team-building orientation program as team leaders and mentors.

Student Clubs

Endicott has an active student organization in charge of many extra-curricular activities and clubs. The student council administers all the clubs, including U.N., Football, Basketball, Photography, Language Clubs, etc. Students can propose to create a new club anytime.

Health Care

All international students are required to purchase Korean medical coverage when they enroll in Endicott. Local clinics and hospitals are equipped with the latest technology and are modern, efficient, and provide excellent health care. Should a student need medical treatment while staying in Korea, the insurance allows the use of medical facilities at a reduced cost.

The seventeen-story SolBridge complex, conveniently located near Daejeon train station, is one of the most modern campuses in Korea, boasting many in-door facilities. In addition to the state-of-the-art classrooms, the building has a modern computer lab, library, auditorium, library, restaurants, coffee shop, swimming pool, and fitness center.

Being part of the Woosong Educational Foundation, students can access the nearby Woosong University campus which has numerous fitness facilities, additional libraries, language laboratories, and international-standard residences.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

Endicott seeks motivated individuals from diverse social, economic, ethnic, and geographic backgrounds. Students at Endicott are encouraged to bring their own diversity and experience into the classroom.


Admission to Endicott is evaluated on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's academic records, English proficiency, financial status, personal essay, extra-curricular activities, and letters of recommendation.

Admission is selective and students are urged to apply as early as possible to ensure sufficient time for application review, visa application, and moving preparations.

General Requirements

- Good Academic Standing
- English Proficiency : IELTS 5.5 or TOEFL 61(iBT)
- Financial Resources : sufficient funds need to be available to cover tuition fees and other expenses.
- Undergraduate applicants who provide English proficiency scores that meet our admissions criteria and pass the online interview will be considered for regular admission. Students applying with scores lower than general admissions requirements may qualify for a conditional acceptance based on the strength of their online interview. In such cases, students will be required to take additional English classes as electives during their first semester of studies.



PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

Who is eligible to apply for our undergraduate program as an international student?

- (1) The applicant must have graduated or will graduate a secondary education institution.

Admissions Process

1. Fill out the online application : The online application can be accessed at www.endicott.ac.kr
2. Make sure you fill out and upload all the required documents
3. Sign and submit your application
4. Endicott uses rolling admissions which means that candidates are invited to submit their applications anytime before the deadline.
5. An interview is NOT required for all admitted candidates. Candidates will be contacted only if an interview is necessary.
6. You do not need to apply separately for scholarship considerations, your application will serve as an application for scholarship as well.
